RE: Rescission of Air Quality Permit to Operate #01001R5

Dear Mr. Waegerle:

On August 1, 2016, this Office received a letter from you requesting rescission of air quality permit #01001R5. This request was initiated do to recent changes in Forsyth County air quality rules that reduce the administrative burden for small facilities with low actual air emissions. These changes allow facilities with actual emissions of particulate matter (PM₁₀), sulfur dioxide, nitrogen oxides volatile organic compounds, carbon monoxide, hazardous air pollutants, and toxic air pollutants less than five (5) tons per year and actual total aggregated emissions less than ten (10) tons per year to be exempt from air quality permitting. Based on the information you provided, this Office hereby rescinds the above referenced permit for VCNA Prestige – Winston-Salem, located at 2865 Lowery Street, Winston-Salem, NC 27101.

This determination is based on the information provided in your letter. If the information used in this determination changes, such that an air quality permit is required, you will be required to apply for and obtain an air quality permit before operating in excess of applicable permitting thresholds.

Please also be advised that Sec. 3Q-0102(d) of the FCAQTC states that because an activity is exempted from being required to have a permit does not mean that the activity is exempted from any applicable requirement or that the owner or operator of the source is exempted from demonstrating compliance with any applicable requirement. Operating a facility in Forsyth County without a required permit is a violation of Sec. 3Q-0101 subject to enforcement action, including civil penalties.
